This past month only produced one request form the public. The request was in reference to a lecturer offering his services. I have turned this request over to Lisa Smother, for the possible interest of the Amboy Historical Society.



On September 19th I attend the monthly meeting of the "Oswego County Historians Association" at the New Haven Town Hall. Enclosed is a copy of the minutes of that meeting. The October meeting was held at the Halfshire Historical Society, in Richland, on Saturday, the 17th. Because of a previous commitment I was not able to attend.
